**A SNIPPET FROM THE YEAR BOOK OF PRAYER:** Our nearby neighbor in Pennsylvania, The Presbytery of Donegal, "has a passionate heart for mission and sends 50 percent of its mission money to the General Assembly." After designating 2008 "The Year of World Mission," a program of speakers, workshops and events gave the presbytery a new perspective on its connection to world mission. From this effort has grown the commissioning of a missionary family to serve in a poverty-stricken area. A young couple has gone to Northern Ireland as Young Adult Volunteers. They write, "This is where God has called us for this year. We realize his plan has worked out much better than our own would have." Additionally, a young woman on a mission trip knew she was being called back to that work.

**HEARTS** were touched and purses opened when we heard Dr. Richard Levandowski speak about and show pictures of Haiti two Sundays ago. Our two "retiring" offerings collected over \$4,000.
